Paul on Predestination:

Predestination in Ephesians:

- 1) The Greek word for predestination is $\pi\rho oo\rho i\zeta \omega$. It is made up of two words:
 - a) πρό
 - i) Meaning: "before, in front of, earlier than"
 - b) Όρίζω
 - i) Meaning: "to separate, appoint, designate"
 - c) We see it used in Ephesians 1:5 and 1:11.
- 2) We take note of the Greek word because it helps us understand it. Consider the Greek word for what is translated as "who were first to hope:" προηλπικότας. It is made up of two words:

<u>Foreknowledge and Election – the Same or Different?</u>:

Consider a quote from the Formula of Concord:

1) "First, we must carefully note the <u>difference between God's eternal foreknowledge and his eternal election of his children to eternal salvation</u>. For *praescientia vel praevisio* (that is, that God sees and knows everything before it happens—what is called God's foreknowledge) applies to all creatures, good and evil. It means that God sees and knows everything that is or will be, everything that happens or will happen, whether it is good or evil, because all things exist in the presence of God, whether they are past or future, and nothing is hidden from him. As it is written in Matthew 10[:29*]: "Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father." And Psalm 139[:16*]: "Your eyes beheld my unformed substance. In your book were written all the days that were formed for me, when none of them as yet existed."

Likewise, Isaiah 37[:28*]: "I know your going out and coming in, and your raging against me."

Consider this quote from the Formula of Concord:

- 3) "...people might fall into burdensome thoughts and say: "Since God has foreseen his elect to salvation 'before the foundation of the world' (Eph. 1[:4*]) and since God's foreknowledge does not fail, nor can anyone change or impede it (Isa. 14[:27*]; Rom. 9[:19*, 11*]), if then I am foreseen to salvation, it cannot harm me if I practice all kinds of sin and vice without repentance, despise Word and sacrament, and have no concern for repentance, faith, prayer, or godly living; still I will and must be saved, for what God foreknows must take place. And if I am not foreknown, it will not help if I hold to God's Word, repent, believe, etc., for I cannot impede or change God's foreknowledge.""

Consider another quote from the Formula of Concord:

- 1) "The eternal election of God, however, or *praedestinatio* (that is, God's preordination to salvation), does not apply to both the godly and the evil, but instead only to the children of God, who are chosen and predestined to eternal life, "before the foundation of the world" was laid, as Paul says (Eph. 1[:4*, 5*]). He chose us in Christ Jesus and 'preordained us to adoption as his children."

'This election is not to be probed in the secret counsel of God but rather is to be sought in the
Word, where it has also been revealed."
Damnation is self-inflicted, whereas salvation is from God's grace.
So, why are some people saved and others are not?
